## What is an ELTT Course?

The Entry Level Trades Training (ELTT) course provides a combination of electrical theory and practical training to prepare you for an apprenticeship in the electrical construction industry.

Participants who successfully complete the course receive a certificate and credit for Level 1 technical training related to the Construction Electrician (Electrical) apprenticeship program.

Topics include electrical theory and Code, Lockout Procedures, Fall Protection, Safety Awareness, WHMIS, Transportation of Dangerous Goods, Confined Space awareness, Hilti certification, Firestop Awareness, and Ladder Safety training



## ELTT is Your Ticket to an Apprenticeship

IBEW Local 213 Electrical Contractors request graduates from the Electrical ELTT program most often. As a graduate of our Electrical ELTT course, you are given preferred access to EJTC (IBEW L. 213) apprenticeships. We select full-time apprenticeship candidates from this program, based on work availability.

The ELTT course is offered six times a year

January, March, May, July, September and November.

English 12 (or equivalent)  
Precalculus 11 (or Principles of Math 11)  
Physics 11

### Commitment

The Electrical ELTT course is a full-time course that consists of 15 weeks of technical training at our training facility followed by 10 weeks of paid work experience

## How to Apply?

In order to apply for the ELTT course, you must submit the following:

- A completed application form ([available here](#)).
- A copy of your official secondary school transcript showing prerequisites successfully completed.
- An up-to-date resume.

## What Happens After You Apply?

If you have met the prerequisites, you will be contacted about the academic placement exam. We will tell you when the exam is, and what you need to do to prepare for it.

Those who pass the exam will be invited to an interview with Electrical Joint Training Committee representatives, who will then select (maximum) 16 students for the next ELTT program.
